

Putting Out Trash and Recycling for Collection Helpful Tips To Follow



- Pile your yard waste neatly in front of your property.
- Cut long limbs or branches into four foot lengths with the exception of palm fronds.
- Do not comingle any other trash with yard waste.
- Containerize grass clippings, leaves, small branches, etc.



- When your garbage and recycling day coincides, place the two containers at least 4 feet apart.
- Place the recycling cart opposite the mailbox, clear of any structures, cars or other trash piles.
- Always have the recycling cart handle facing the property.
- Place containers no more than
 2 feet away from the road or curb.



- This is an example of improper trash set out. All solid waste must be containerized.
- Non containerized trash attracts pickers and scrappers causing further scattering of the pile.
- Order a dumpster to contain large piles of bulky trash as seen here.
 Call Waste Pro for a quote.
- Construction, demolition or renovation debris accumulated at the site of a project must be put in a commercial container until removed.



All Services

- Set out time is no later than 7:00 A.M. on your service day.
- · Set containers out the night before, if possible.

Containers

- Containerize your garbage and trash. Stack bulky items neatly.
- Trash cans, bags etc. must weigh under 50 lbs. to be collected by hand.

Materials Prohibited Curbside

- Oil based paint (Latex paint must be dried out with the lid off)
- Automotive parts and fluids
- · Swimming pool chemicals
- · Propane / Gas tanks
- · Pesticides and Herbicides
- Lead acid batteries

Note: Some residential materials listed above are considered Household Hazardous Waste and can be disposed of free of charge at the St. Lucie County Baling & Recycling Facility: 6120 Glades Cut Off Road, Fort Pierce.
